SUBJECT: Tenth Republic Anniversary Celebrations, 1980.

In keeping with a series of activities arranged for the Tenth Anniversary of the Republic Celebrations, the National Task Force has identified two events on the planned programme which is geared for maximum participation and involvement of all workers.

- 2. The events referred to above are scheduled to take place on <u>Friday</u>, 22nd <u>February</u>, 1980 at the places and times stipulated hereunder:-
 - (i) People's Parade March Past at 1763 Monument 7.00 a.m.
 - (ii) Flag Raising Ceremony National Park 9.30 p.m.
- 3. The first event which is the People's Parade will depart from seven (7) assembly points around Georgetown, details of which will appear in the press for general information. It is suggested that workers should be urged as much as possible, either to assemble and proceed from their respective places of work to one of the assembly points, or alternatively, gather at one of the assembly points nearest to their homes which is considered most convenient to allow for maximum participation in the parade. As regards the second event, persons should also be encouraged to assemble early at the National Park in the evening of the same day to witness the Flag Raising Ceremony.
- 4. It is expected that the significance of these two special events would be readily understood. As such, persons should be made responsible for mobilizing staff members and should also endeavour to do so with the sole objective of achieving the desired results.
- 5. All Permanent Secretaries, Heads of Departments, General Managers of Public Corporations and Public Companies are asked to invite the attention of all members of staff under their control, to the contents of this circular; and ensure in a practicable manner, their total involvement towards the overall success of these events.
