SUBJECT: Introduction of the Guyana Airways Corporation B737 Super Jet Services.

The Guyana Airways Corporation will be introducing its B737 Super Jet Service on 9th September, 1980. It will offer world-wide connections with direct flights to port-of-Spain, Barbados, Miami and Paramaribo. The direct service to Miami affords connections throughout North America. Similarly, connections to London and Europe may be made <u>via</u> Port-of-Spain and Barbados.

- 2. The new service has arisen out of the need for greater comfort and improved services at home and abroad and has been undertaken at considerable cost. It is therefore essential that the Super Jet Service be a success from the financial and other aspects.
- 3. Guyana Airways Corporation now has far greater capacity and is aiming to provide service of a higher standard. The Corporation is therefore relying heavily on the full support of the Public Service/Sector, in order to off-set the enormous out-lay involved.
- 4. It is expected that all bookings for flights, local or <u>overseas</u>, by personnel employed within the Public Service/Sector, will be channeled through the Guyana Airways Corporation.
