Amendment to General Order No. 44.

It is hereby notified for general information that, with effect from 1st January, 1980, General Order 44, is amended as follows:

“Retention of Non-pensionable Employees to the end of the Calendar Year in which they attain 65 years.”

Non-pensionable employees who do not qualify for a gratuity when they attain the age of 60 years may be allowed to continue in employment up to the age 65 years or to the end of the calendar year in which they attain the age of 65 years in order to enable them to so qualify. Similarly, non-pensionable employees who, when they attain the age of 60 years, have not less than 15 years continuous service if they hold non-pensionable offices, may be allowed to continue in employment up to the age of 65 years or to the end of the calendar year in which they attain the age of 65 years in order to enable them to qualify for an annual allowance. The above conditions in both cases are subject to the employees being physically fit to continue working during the qualifying period and to the provisions governing superannuation benefits payable to non-pensionable employees laid down in the Legislative Council Resolutions and the Pensions Act Chapter 27:02.
