The Guyana Trades Union Congress has organized a number of activities to mark May Week, 1988. While all events planned for this occasion are important to Public Servants, I set out below details of the three (3) major ones: -

- (a) May Week Celebrations commence with a Wreath Laying Ceremony at the statue of the late Hubert Nathaniel Critchlow in the Parliament Buildings Compound to be held on Sunday, April 24, 1988 at 16:30 hrs. There will be several speeches at this ceremony at which affiliates of the Guyana Trades Union Congress and other representative organisation will lay floral tributes.
- (b) The Workers' Day Parade and Rally will be held on May Day, Sunday, May 1, 1988. The Parade which will assemble at Independence Park (opposite Promenade Gardens) at 7:00 hrs., comprises a route march through the streets of Georgetown leading to the National Park where the Rally will be held. Information relating to the route of the Parade will be given on the radio and in the press. Public Servants are asked to march behind the banners of their respective unions. Prizes will be awarded for the best uniformed and turned out contingents on parade..
- (c) The culmination of the celebrations will be a Day of Sports starting at 10:00 hrs., on Sunday, 8th May, 1988 at Guyana Public Service Union Sports Complex Ground, Thomas Lands. Admission is free.
