Mashramani Celebrations 1992.

The Central Mashramani Committee has organized a number of activities to celebrate Mashramani 1992. While all the events planned for the occasion are important, I set out below details of two major activities which are of interest to Public Servants:

- (a) People's Parade.
- (b) Flag Raising Ceremony.

2. People's Parade 1992 will be held on Friday 21st February, 1992. The Parade will move off from the Independence Park (formerly Parade Ground) at 07:30 hours and participants are asked to assemble at 07:00 hours.
3. From Independence Park the parade will move east into Middle Street, south into Camp Street, east into Durban Street, and north into Vlissengen Road where the salute will be taken at the Square of the Revolution.
4. As is customary, prizes and trophies are awarded to competing agencies. On this occasion, the judging will be based on strength (number of participants), enthusiasm and orderliness on the march. Ministries, Corporations, Private Sector Companies and other agencies excluding the Military and Para-Military will be the contestants.
5. Each ministry / agency is required to prepare an appropriate banner so that it can be identified. Prizes are normally awarded for the best on display. The theme for People's Parade 1992 is “Rewarding Productivity in 1992”.
6. To ensure optimal participation which is voluntary, Permanent Secretaries and Heads of Departments are urged to provide transportation to the assembly point and back to the respective Ministries. The

Permanent Secretaries and Heads of Departments are also encouraged to provide any other facility which may assist in the mobilization of and participation by staff.

7. Each Region will be responsible for planning its own celebrations. Therefore there is no need for the movement of personnel from the regions to the center.
8. The Flag Raising Ceremony 1992 will take place on Saturday 22nd February 1992 at the National Park at midnight.
9. The Ceremony will be preceded by a number of cultural events which begin at 21:00 hours. The gates of the National Park will open at 19:00 hours. All members of staff are invited to the occasion.
10. Please bring the contents of this Circular to the attention of all workers in your organization and encourage them to participate fully in the foregoing events.
